Fine Arts Workshops and Training

Inclusive Canada:

This year, through funding support from Government of Ontario, AADN was able to provide training to seniors through our project "*Inclusive Canada*". Our workshops and training programs brought seniors together to share their stories, paint and showcase their creativity. With support from Halton Gujarati Seniors Samaj, we successfully implemented the project and mobilized seniors.













Festivals and Events

AADN informs, organizes and encourages local artists and artisans in Scarborough and the Greater Toronto Area to partake in festivals and events which showcase their talents and creativity.

AADN aims to raise the awareness of communities about the rich cultural diversity in arts, crafts and performing arts through the organization of festivals and events that support the mandate of the organization. This year AADN was able to execute events such as:

Canadian Multicultural Day

Artists and Artisans Development and Network, in collaboration with community organizations, dance and cultural groups, held an event on June 27 to celebrate Canadian Multicultural Day. This event is based on the theme of inclusion and integration of visible minorities, newcomers, refugees, and ethnocultural communities. The event featured cake cutting for seniors, seniors talk and speeches from community leaders. Through funding support from Canadian Heritage, and with support from Agincourt Community Services, we were successful in executing this celebration.









Festivals and Events

Being Women: Her Voice through Arts

With support from neighborhood partners and other artists, AADN holds an annual event for young immigrant girls and women to display their creative contributions through visual arts, and cultural performances and express themselves about what it means to be a woman. Girls are mentored by female artists as they learn to express their feelings on equality, equity, empowerment and safety through art. This unique equity project increased awareness on gender equity, build confidence and provide a sense of accomplishment in girls. Shingeri Vidhya Bharati Foundation, Vraj Community Services, Sheetal Sangeet along with Cultural HotSpot helped us in making this project a success.



AADN sponsored and supported the events organized by our community partners. With Friends of Gujarat, we support in their Navratri Dance Festival; with Halton Gujarati Seniors Samaj, we supported in their Festival of Lights events; with Starbiz Community Service AADN supported their Bollywood Music at Aga Khan Museum; with Shabdh Prathna a talk show on wellbeing and community development and with Diversity Cultural Association, AADN supported Osman Mir event. This collaboration helped us to outreach in different community and get familiarized about the work AADN does in community building through arts and performing arts.










Documentaries

75 Seniors: Stories on Volunteerism is a documentary on the experiences of senior volunteers across Canada and the work they do for their communities. The film expanded on the benefits of volunteering and its positive impact on the seniors and the city. Shirin Mandani




Team
